This includes: uniforms, ground maintenance, sports equipment, first aid kits and coaching.</p> <p>Travel and accommodation costs for teams attending tournaments in New Zealand will be considered provided costs are actual and reasonable and an official invitation or itinerary endorsed by the host's national body is supplied.</p> |

It must also have Charities Commission registration or an IRD income tax exemption (e.g. for sports bodies as a body promoting amateur games and sports).</p> <p>Funding is shared between the areas of community, which includes arts, culture, heritage and environment (30%), health (15%), sport (40%) and education (15%).</p> <p>All grants must be used for goods and services within New Zealand to meet Inland Revenue requirements and we can generally only fund events or projects that will take place during the next six months. We cannot fund any retrospective activities or transactions already incurred e.g. deposits and purchases made prior to approval of the grant. No exceptions.</p> <p>To be eligible for a grant, your club/organisation must be taking part in a 'bona fide' event sanctioned by a legitimate regional or national body that is organised as a controlling body of the sport. It must also have genuine standards and rules. play on a regular basis as part of a significant</p> |
